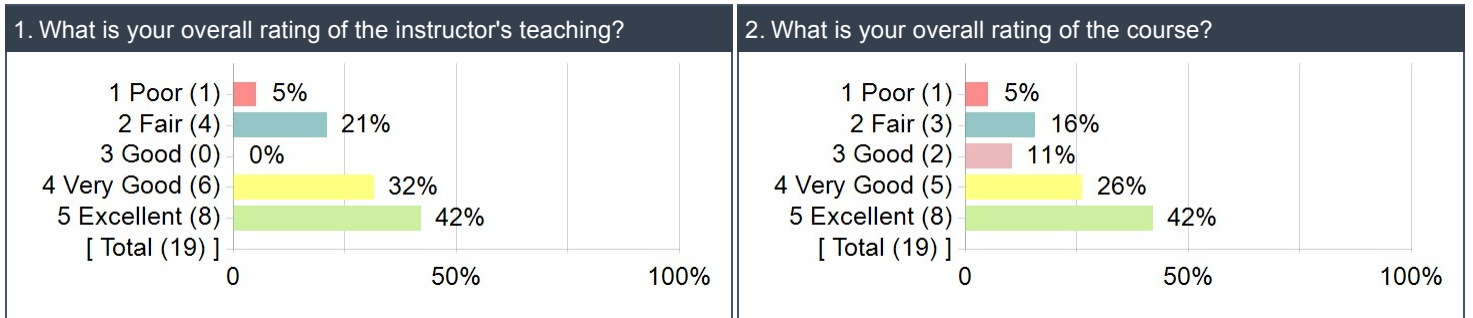

I think it would be helpful to give a bit more time during exams if possible, or have a less strict deadline to turn them in. Towards the end of exams, I would start to be concerned that I would not have enough time to submit the exams in the right format.
Give more time on the exams. I always felt rushed on the exams, I scored above an 85 on both midterms but never had a chance to look over my work. Always had to work to the last minute
